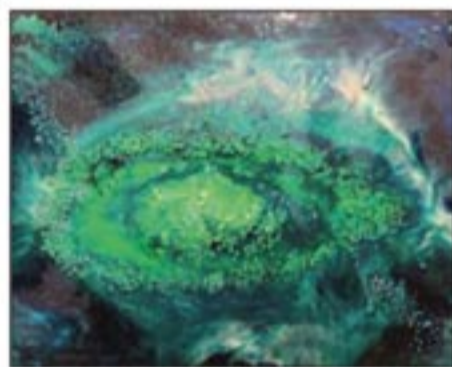

IAD, she noted, is a non-profit organization

The art works on display at Building No 5 at Katara Cultural Village cover the works of artists in diversified forms including canvas, abstract floral, acrylic and resin, porcelain, paper sculpture etc.
